

THERE ARE NO DISTRACTIONS HERE; NO BEACH HAWKERS PUSHING SARONGS OR TAXI DRIVERS PLEADING FOR BUSINESS, NO INDUSTRY OR EVEN AGRICULTURE. ONLY TRANQUILLITY.

These are the most beautiful small islands in the world. From afar they appear like sapphire gems set in white stone and placed on a canvas of cobalt blue. TRAVEL GUIDE

WHEN TO GO

The Maldives has a benign climate, with year-round temperatures between 26°C - 30°C. It never suffers from tornadoes though it does have a monsoon season in November, albeit rain showers in short, afternoon bursts. The high season stretches from November to April, with Christmas and New Year being the most coveted time to travel. The most perfect months are January, February and March when the sky is blue and the water so calm you would be forgiven for thinking it could be a painting.

WHERE TO STAY

Minor Hotel Group has six stunning resorts under the Anantara, Naladhu and Per AQUUM brands offering luxury over water villas and the only house style accommodation to be found in the Maldives that blends seamlessly with the mesmerising beauty of its natural surrounds. Calm, crystal clear waters lap palm - fringed white sand beaches. A variety of choice awaits you at every turn. Numerous beaches, a multitude of activities and a tempting array of enticing dining options.

EXCURSIONS

Once arriving at the resort, you're almost certain to want to most your time there, except the odd excursion into the azure waters. But for the curious and adventurous, boat trips to local inhabited islands reveal coral houses, woodwork artisans and colourful doorways of the local people.

TRANSFERS

Transfers used to be a matter of jumping into a dhoni (local boat) and chugging off to your resort. These days the resorts span the whole archipelago so you transfer could be by boat, by plane, or both. Speedboats have replaced dhonis for the nearer resorts; seaplanes take guests to the more distant ones, and fixed wheel planes carry guests to the five regional airports, from where it's another trip on a speedboat.

CURRENCY

The Maldivian currency is the Rufiyaa but tourists have no need of it. Resort bills are best paid by credit card at the end of the stay and other expenses, such as tips and purchases when on excursion, are best paid in American dollars.

LOCAL LAWS, ETIQUETTE

As tourists remain ensconced on separate islands, local laws and customs do not apply. When visiting local inhabited islands, it is recommended that you dress modestly. It is not a matter of covering your head but simply means of taking a more conservative approach to fashion.

In 1972 his dream was realised when Maglieri Wines Pty Ltd was established and later, in 2000, Serafino Winery was born. Today, Steve is still at the helm and with the assistance of his family and award-winning winemaker Charles Whish. Serafino produces an exceptional range of Italian-style wines such as Lagrein, Vermentino, Sangiovese, Pino Grigio and Primitivo plus the Spanish variety Tempranillo, as well as classic McLaren Vale varieties including the most revered - McLaren Vale Shiraz.

"The weekend farmers market in Willunga are also worth the visit. Choose from hand-made breads, tarts, cured and smoked meats, artisan chocolate and a smorgasbord of fresh seasonal fruit and vegies straight from the local farmers fields. And if you love cheese as much as I do. Blessed Cheese in the main street of McLaren Vale is provedore perfection with a range of local and imported cheeses, chutney, olive oil and smallgoods to suit every taste." says Daniel.

BEACHSIDE SEA BOUNTY

Glenela is South Australia's most popular beachside destination and is just a 35 minute drive from McLaren Vale and 10 kilometres from Adelaide city making it the ideal central place to stay to enjoy what the entire region has to offer.

Jetty Road is a must visit and there is always something new to see or do. 

1 CALOUNDRA, SUNSHINE COAST, QUEENSLAND

Home to a number of stellar surfing, fishing, sailing and swimming spots perfect for beginners along with grassy picnic parks and bike friendly boardwalks, Caloundra on Queensland's Sunshine Coast is a favourite with families. It may be a rarity to see a Koala in the wild, but at the pristine Tomaree National Park, your chances are assured if you take the walking track along the banks of the Tillgerry Creek where a colony of these cute and cuddly critters are regularly spied.
