That it has so much more to offer than the temples, as long as you are prepared to explore and discover, Cambodia. The countryside, remote islands and wildlife.

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

MOZAMBIQUE AFRICA'S RISING STAR

ALONG MOZAMBIQUE'S STUNNING NORTH COAST, ANCIENT DHOWS ARE HELPING TO REVITALISE THE LOCAL ECONOMY. TRADE AND FISHING DHOWS HAVE BEEN A COMMON SIGHT ON MOZAMBIQUE'S QUIRIMBAS ARCHIPELAGO FOR CENTURIES, BUT NOW THEY HAVE A NEW USE – TAKING TOURISTS ISLAND-HOPPING AROUND THE WARM TURQUOISE WATERS OF THE INDIAN OCEAN.

The past decade has seen Mozambique embrace a new generation of travellers bedazzled by what the country has to offer: Magical off shore islands, excellent diving, a 2,500km coastline and a fascinating cultural scene.

In this long strip of land running from Tanzania in the north to South Africa in the south, Portuguese colonial heritage fuses with African traditions, humpback whales migrate up the coast while lions and zebras roam the interior. Gaining independence from Portugal in 1975 Mozambique fell into almost two decades of economic ruin and guerilla warfare before finding stability after the 1993 peace accords. While the politics remain as spicy as their food the past two decades has seen major advancements in tourism.

New developments are most noticeable in the national capital, Maputo, which is in Mozambique's far south and is the first port of call for most travellers. A vibrant capital city, Maputo features luxury villas overlooking the blue expanse of Maputo Bay where Portuguese-style pavement cafés offer respite from the streetside bustle. A colourful array of restaurants serve spicy samosas, sizzling steaks and seafood platters.

Mozambique's north is in many ways a different land, with vast tracts of dense bush and rugged mountains in the interior and idyllic islands scattered along the coastline. Getting around here takes time, but the coastal panoramas and sense of space and the sheer adventure of travel make the journey well worthwhile.

The port city of Pemba, on the northern coast, is a prime destination for water sports

and diving enthusiasts with a stunning coral reef and a beautiful coastline. A short flight north from Pemba reveals the Quirimbas island chain, a clutch of 32 pristine coral islands and islets. This UNESCO world heritage site stretches for 320km up to the Tanzanian border and this is where the islands of Medjumbe and Matemo sit like jewels in the Indian Ocean. White sand beaches, turquoise waters and luxurious accommodation make these the perfect island resorts for anyone seeking an African paradise.

Further south leads to the Bazaruto archipelago, a national marine park surrounded by turquoise waters rich with marine life. The largest island, 35km-long Bazaruto is the kind of escape where you can spend your days swinging in a hammock or swimming and snorkelling amid well-preserved coral formations. At night the stars





illuminate the sand banks before the sun rises above the Indian Ocean, bringing into view a fantastic array of marine life.

As you explore, you'll see fish eagles, flamingos, and many other bird species. Dolphins and mantra rays are easily identified in the clear waters, while whale sharks swim through the depths. They are joined by many other types of fish plus leatherback, loggerhead and green turtles. If you're lucky, you may even spot one of Bazaruto's rare dugong, who spend their days foraging among the sea-grass meadows.

But Mozambique is more than just lazing on soft sandy beaches. Once one of Africa's top big game destinations, the country's wild reserves are recovering rapidly and are becoming a top choice for off-the-beaten-track safaris, regaining the country's reputation as both a game viewing and beach holiday destination. There has never been a better time to discover Mozambique, the rising star of Africa.





TRAVEL GUIDE

WHEN TO GO

Because of Mozambique's size it is best to focus on either the south or the north. Southern Mozambique's climate is ideal almost year round, apart from January, which can get very hot. In the north, the main rains fall from mid-February through April, and temperatures are somewhat higher than in the south.

WHERE TO STAY

Minor Hotel Group has three stunning resorts and a fourth set to open in 2015. Anantara's heartfelt hospitality can be enjoyed on the islands of Bazaruto and Medjumbe, while AVANI Pemba Beach Hotel & Spa is a perfect base for business and leisure travellers alike.

EXCURSIONS

Mozambique is teaming with wildlife reserves and some of the best diving locations in Africa. Travel in the south is made easy with the development of new road systems while island hopping in the north is convenient with airports and ferry services linking the islands together. The rugged mountains and thick bush of the inland north make for a challenging and rewarding adventure.



TRANSFERS

Airport transfer services to each of the resorts are available to and from the nearest international airports in Maputo, Pemba and Bazaruto. Medjumbe is serviced with its own airstrip.

CURRENCY

The metical is the currency of Mozambique, abbreviated with the symbol MZN or MTN. It is nominally divided into 100 centavos.

A handshake is the most common greeting between men, women, strangers and friends.


People beckon one another by holding the hand palm-side out and bringing the fingers down towards your palm in a scratching motion.




Ayurveda, meaning the "science of life", is an approach to well-being that can be traced back over 5,000 years to the Indian sub-continent, making it the world's oldest healthcare system. Entirely holistic, its adherents strive to create harmony between the body, mind, and spirit, maintaining that this balance prevents illness, treats acute conditions, and contributes to a long and healthy life

In recent decades Ayurvedic medicine has spread around the world but remains India's primary healthcare system. More than 90 percent of the continent's population use some form of Ayurvedic therapy, following its dietary principles, practicing traditional medicine, or seeking professional help from trained Ayurvedic practitioners.

THE TRI-DOSHA THEORY

The three unique energies, better known as Doshas, are Vata, Pitta and Kapha. Everyone has a unique combination of doshas which define a person's temperament and characteristics. Each person has a natural state comprising a combination of these three energies, and should seek balance by modulating their behaviour or environment.





Vata is the force of propulsion. It governs all movement, including muscles, nerve impulses and thoughts. Literally meaning 'wind', it is the element of Ether and Air in the body and a subtle dosha that goes out of balance easily. Vata people often suffer from depletion of nutrients. Their behaviour is creative when balanced, or erratic and dispersed when imbalanced. Vata senses are hearing and touch.

Pitta is the principle of heat, digestion and all transformation in the body. Pitta is the acid secretion from the stomach, bile from the liver, and inflammation. In the body, the element of Fire always comes with Water. Pitta can also color the skin and create freckles and red hair. Pitta's sense is vision and a strong sense of smell.

Kapha is growth of tissue, production of mucous and fat, and retention of fluids. As such, Kapha is Water and Earth, and the stable, relaxed dosha. It is the force of consolidation, solidity and denseness. Kapha people are great homemakers. Kapha senses are taste and smell.

From humble street-style cafes to bursting-at-the-seams noodle bars, lavish establishments fronted by Michelin starred chefs to glittering roof top bars and sublime supper clubs, Melbourne fuses an eclectic medley of cultures and cuisines to tempt every palette.

While the renowned 'eat streets' are easy to find and perennially popular with visitors, if you are looking to sample some of Melbourne's undisputed best, take your lead from the locals who have hand selected a few favourites within easy walking distance from a selection of Oaks Hotels & Resorts' Melbourne city properties.





FLOWER DRUM

- 17 MARKET LANE

The 15 page wine list is epic, as is the food, including an Australian oyster menu depicted by region and dishes imbuing the famous McConnell rustic farmhouse feel. Prepare to wait, as the restaurant has a no reservations policy ensuring first in best dressed is order of the day.

Stay: Oaks on Market, an easy 1.2 kilometre walk along Flinders Lane.

VUE DE MONDE

- LEVEL 55/RIALTO 525 COLLINS STREET

The decadent and highly awarded Vue De Monde is poised 55 stories above the CBD within the iconic Rialto Tower, formerly Melbourne's tallest building and offering sweeping views across the city. Shannon Bennett presents a French inspired menu that includes indigenous delicacies such as salt cured wallaby and emu jerky with the finest matches in wine and champagne. The degustation menu is famous; the more sedate four-course 'choice' menu or impressive 10-course 'freedom' menu both offer journeys in sublime gastronomy.

Stay: Oaks on Collins, across the road from the famous Rialto, home to Vue De Monde.



For over a decade now, Anantara's extensive grassroots activities have demonstrated a 100% commitment to protecting our beautiful planet, conserving cultural traditions and bettering the lives of local communities. Ever since the first resort opened in 2001, Anantara has become synonymous with creating unique luxury travel experiences in some of the world's richest cultures and most exotic landscapes. As part of these experiences, all Anantara properties worldwide immerse themselves in local initiatives that give back to the community and environment, thereby enhancing the social and environmental surroundings of each Anantara destination.

With 2014 now underway, Anantara has embarked on a number of new and unique sustainability projects that not only supports local communities but also protects nature and wildlife ensuring a prosperous future for younger generations.

CARDAMOM MOUNTAINS - CAMBODIA

In late 2013 Anantara was approached by the US/ Cambodian Conservation NGO Wildlife Alliance for assistance in protecting 18,000 hectares of forest in Cambodia's Cardamom Mountains, with the aim of creating a corridor for elephants and other animals.



Contributions from Anantara's parent company Minor International have funded the building, manning and equipment for ranger stations to patrol the land, to prevent hunting and illegal logging. Beyond the benefits for wildlife, it is calculated that the forest holds more than 5,000,000 tonnes of carbon, which would be released into the atmosphere if the partnership with the Wildlife Alliance did not exist.

ELEPHANT CONSERVATION/ EDUCATION - THAILAND

Famous for staging the King's Cup Elephant Polo Tournament in Thailand Anantara's popular charity event has raised over US\$750,000 which has been donated to a number of causes that better the lives of domestic and wild elephant populations throughout Thailand. Money from last year's event has been donated to a number of 'world first' environmental and educational causes.

Funding from last year's event is currently being used to introduce educational conservation programmes by Think Elephant International (TEI) to over 600 students from 20 schools in Thailand who learn about elephant behaviour, conservation, human-elephant conflict and scientific research, as well as training and supporting Conservation Biology graduates to become TEI classroom teachers





Money from the tournament has also helped set up the world's first Thai Elephant Therapy Project (TETP) in conjunction with Chiang Mai University and the Thai Elephant Conservation Centre. The programme is designed to provide autistic children with an opportunity to develop their social interaction and emotional skills by using elephants as a working partner with occupational therapists.

The elephants used in the project have been rescued from the streets of Thailand and have gone through specific training to ensure that they are healthy and well prepared for the clinical research sessions. The elephants are accompanied by their expert mahout handlers, alongside human therapists and researchers.

The programme now runs a series of free therapy sessions for Thai children and this year the TETP also intends to expand the research aiming to widen the scope of the clinics to include children with Down Syndrome and other conditions.

This year's 13th King's Cup Elephant Polo Tournament is scheduled for 28 - 31 August and aims to raise even more money than ever to donate to various projects that benefit the elephants of Thailand.

WHAT'S YOUR IRMA-INSPIRED AVATAR?

JASMIN KHEZRI THE AWARD-WINNING CREATOR OF ICONIC ILLUSTRATED STYLE ICON IRMA, GIVES US A UNIQUE INSIGHT INTO HER GLOB-TROTTING ALTER-EGO AND HER PLANS FOR THE PER AQUUM DREAM CALENDAR.



HOW DID YOU COME UP WITH THE INSPIRATION BEHIND IRMA?

When I had the idea of creating an iconic illustrative character in 1996, I did not have to think twice: IRMA would be her name. My grandmother, Irma, was an inspirational force in my life. She encapsulated and brought to life the virtues of a strong, independent and cosmopolitan modern woman - always ahead of her generation. Above all, she was full of love and had a desire to learn and explore, fuelled by curiosity and

open-mindedness. Everything she did, she did with authentic style. Every piece of furniture, fabric and artwork, and every travel and culinary experience was joyfully selected with care. And as diverse as everything may have been, it all formed one authentic unity. Because she was no follower and her style was authentic, she impressed. Her good genes empowered her to live a healthy and active life until she died in her sleep at the age of 92. IRMA was born.

HOW HAS IRMA EVOLVED OVER THE YEARS?

First I did illustrations for fashion magazines, like Marie Claire and Elle in Germany and Tatler in the UK, but because Lam also a journalist L started to put a story behind the character. She became my alter ego. Whenever I wrote about my travels, fashion experiences or beauty tricks she became more and more alive. Other women started to identify with IRMA and they related to her. Established brands recognised the potential too. For example, Procter & Gamble in the US did a big advertisement campaign with IRMA for Noxzema and the French fashion House Céline produced t-shirts and foulards. Kiehls used IRMA illustrations for their famous crème de corps. Soon we will be launching our new IRMA accessory collection.

Vinum's temperature is electronically regulated to create the perfect environment. The bottles are showcased in floor to ceiling wine racks, creating a welcoming atmosphere and adding a new dimension to paradise.

DINING EVENTS

Cellar Door takes place every evening where experts can test their knowledge against the Island Sommelier, and novices can discover the interesting side to wine and its history.


